The Warren Commission

Recent articles in *The Washington Post* concerning the Kennedy assassination have aroused my interest in the subject. I have proceeded to read most of the published books criticizing the Warren Commission Report in addition to the report itself. I think that anyone who reads the Warren Commission Report and then proceeds to read the criticisms by Mark Lane, Harold Weisburg, Thomas Buchanan, and Edward Epstein will end up feeling the same way I do—doubtful regarding the adequacy of the report and crime investigation as a whole in the United States.

The inconsistencies of the report deserve further explanation; and the criticisms merit refuting. Some of the criticisms are obviously valid and can be so simply cleared up that I do not see why a short re-investigation has not been started. I feel that a great disservice has been rendered to the American people and I hope that the people will not easily accept the Warren Report. Congress should take this matter up in the next session.
