Dear Mr. Williams,

Your last sentence in your letter postmarked the 8th says it all:  
It is an American tragedy.

I am quite interested in both Operation Phoenix and Fort Holabird. One of the characters in one of the books I cannot now get printed is a graduate of two Fort Holabird schools. I'm putting the clipping aside until later tonight, when I can read it with care. I do not get the Village Voice and they have boycotted me from the first, refusing to do or say anything about any of the books until Lane's came out, when they could then say he did everything, etc. As a matter of fact, this has been true of all the Underground and Overground Underground press.

It is both kind and helpful of you to send me the things you do, but before you buy books, may I suggest you ask if I have them? I do have the Curry book, sent me by a Texas friend. I take it this is what you refer to as "JFK Assassination File", for it is his title, as closely as the cover permits isolating a title. It will not go to waste, for I know others who can use it, but I do not know the state of your finances, and while I appreciate your helpfulness, I do not want it to be a burden to you and, on the other hand, if you have to watch how you spend money, getting me a duplicate might preclude getting something else that is not a duplicate.

The domestic operations of the CIA trouble me more than their foreign ones, for there is little doubt they are precluded by law and the intent of Congress. It is the frustration and denial of the democratic process as it is of any kind of decent society for them to take unto themselves that which is denied them. It is also the essence of a police state, regardless of motive or intent.

I had a report that Quie's book is finally going to appear. I am surprised and I frankly never believed he would engage in such a self-defamation.

Another book is due in March, by the publisher who did the Brenner book against Garrison, Potter. It is by Al Newman, who, I believe, is the man who personally blocked the 1965 publication of WHITEWASH by a small publisher who had sought his opinion, he having represented himself to one of that group as an expert on the subject. If my recollection is correct, he is some kind of rightist.

The difficulty of obtaining

"The Company" can be illustrated  
by the enclosed article.

I have some experience  
and friendships with "Company"  
employees and in fact my  
family once rented their  
summer home from the  
late Mathias Cohea, one of a  
three man board who re-  
viewed the C.I.A. in 1948 for  
President Truman.

Consequently, I understand  
the Herculean task of ex-  
tracting verifacative information  
from any source. Those willing

to take heed do so only "off  
the record" and informers  
usually prove upon closer  
checking to be "worthless paper"  
hangers like Bailey.

Practically nothing substantive  
has been published or is  
publishable about the domestic  
operations of "The Company".

The penetration of "The  
Company" and its affiliates  
has occurred on many levels  
- from The Mafia (See the case  
of Herbert Oskin) to American  
Friends of The Middle East.

The operational pattern  
of The King assassination  
followed The Dallas execution  
even in small details.

The murder of Robert  
Kennedy was procedurally  
different.

The about face of William  
Huie seems instructive.

As long as "racists" were  
presumed the quiet party  
Huie was quite willing to  
track down leads but when  
it became apparent his  
information was leading into  
a different area, he joined  
the chorus of "no conspiracy".
