Dear Mr. Williams,

Bickel is an intellectual whore and a Judenrat, but thanks for the clippings of his review.

Despite the fact that most publishers are of like character, and from my own experience I know this includes Award (one o. whose executives quit when they declined one of my books), there are things that may, legitimately, have persuaded them not to do the Jones and Turner books, things having to do with the dependability of content and newness. You do not know those men as I do. Not all of what has been produced on "our side" is uniformly constructive and original. Random House is similar. What they did with Sevage is worse than what they did to Maggie Field. They broke their contract with him in 1965 because he wouldn't soften and change his book. The reason they gave Maggie, mechanical problems with format, was a spurious. Hers was original, solid work. It should have been published. I've had similar experiences with them also. Books supporting the Commission have had an easier time, but even there it has changed, or Brener's book would have been done by a larger house. Potter is not even doing his own distribution with it.

Your New Orleans analysis, is without question precise and accurate.

Your reference to Robin Moore's disclosure of assassination schools interests me much. If I have it, I've forgotten it. I'd appreciate it if you could send me the reference, if it is a book, or the clipping if an article. I can copy and return. The same is true of the foundation-connections of Sarah Hughes and Leon Jaworski. I may have it deep in some file and have forgotten it. Especially with Jaworski does this interest me.

My work on the King assassination is more than 300,000 words long. I cannot get it published, either, and now have such debts I cannot risk more indebtedness to print it myself.

I suggest you are too kind to Finck in saying he "could not bear to look". Much worse, he did, then injured himself! I prepared Oser for that examination, including with my then-unpublished material from two of the three books I am doing on the autopsy, both of which are written.
