Dear Ed,

I've read w/ interest "Publishing Conglomerates". It is a very considerable and interesting and gets me the wrong impression, that a really material difference would be when these houses became part of large corporations. Not so, at least w/ non-fiction, and I doubt there ever has been an author with as extensive, personal experience. I was by own merit,

The difference is superficial and in degree only. The worst part of this troubled business is, the self-imposition, not the dictation. Although I have no doubt it would have been justified, I never got a single serious literary criticism of *WHITEFACE*. Internationally, the rejections were about 100. Dell turned it down thrice then gave for it. This story mentions but one house with which I had no dealings, and almost no person. My biggest single mistake was not going to Holt when Chen was there. But with these publishing power and with the refusal of a friend of CHI's who they published, I felt it wilfully. EH Read the book then told me they do not publish new authors.

This sort of thing needs airing, I regret I'm still so far short of the terrible truth.

And then what they can do to a book or an author when there is pressure.
