

FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION  
Date 3/28/94

1. Sergeant SPENCE T. BROWN, Dallas Division, Dallas Police Department, advised that on March 26, 1993, at about 4:45 P.M., PAYTEL MAIN, City Hall Night Telephone Operator, called him at his office regarding a telephone call from a man identified as VICTOR SIMONSON, and that SIMONSON wanted to talk to someone about the assassination of President JAMES EARL RAY. Sergeant BROWN stated that he told PAYTEL MAIN he would accept the call and PAYTEL MAIN was talking with SIMONSON and the Victoria, Canada, operator. Sergeant BROWN stated he would accept the call and that he was responsible to accept the collect call.

Sergeant BROWN stated he authorized the operator to accept the collect call and SIMONSON said he was in Dallas on November 22, 1963, and made some phone calls. Sergeant BROWN stated that this was the reason he believed he got the Texas School Book Depository Building in the background. According to Sergeant BROWN, he was not sure if the operator was an employee with "deep-angle, mega-lens."

SIMONSON stated he had been talking to his attorney, PAYTEL (phonetic) and that PAYTEL MAIN was in the office. Sergeant BROWN stated that PAYTEL MAIN was in the office. Sergeant BROWN stated that SIMONSON claimed he had not seen the film developed and did not know exactly what it showed.

Sergeant BROWN stated he told SIMONSON that he would contact the President's Commission in Washington, D. C., and send the pictures to him, but that SIMONSON said he would not want to do this. Sergeant BROWN stated he would mail the file to him (Sergeant BROWN) airmail on March 28, 1994.

Sergeant BROWN advised that PAYTEL MAIN, the switchboard operator, contacted the Paytel Company, to trace this call, and through Columbia Telephone Company, to trace this call and, through this person, it was determined that this phone number was registered to E. H. W. SMITH, 1141 Columbia, Victoria, British Columbia.

Sergeant BROWN stated he would immediately contact the Dallas FBI Office on receipt of this file.

Under date of March 26, 1964, the Seattle Office advised that Corporal S. G. BLACKMORE, Royal Canadian Mounted Police, Victoria, British Columbia, had made no date interviewed BALFE, NEILSON, WILLIAM SHELL, 1141 California Street, Victoria, British Columbia, and was given the telephone number 251-2111. The Seattle Police Department on March 24, 1964. He stated he was making a fictitious name, claimed he had never been to Dallas, Texas; and, had a file of the assassination of President Kennedy. The Seattle Police Department advised that the telephone number given on the telephone call was the one that he had been using at a television station and had been drinking and decided to make the call. According to Corporal BLACKMORE, SHELL is "given to dreams." SHELL's last con-

Under date of March 26, 1964, the Seattle Office advised that Corporal S. E. O'BRIEN, Seattle Police Department, Victoria, British Columbia, had on that date interviewed MURRAY KENNETH SHEEHAN, 1141 Caldwell Street, Victoria, British Columbia, who admitted making the telephone call to the Ballymore Apartments, Victoria, on March 26, 1964, to alarm him that his fellow room mate, claimed he was going to Dallas, Texas, and had as file of the assassination of President KENNEDY. The Seattle Office advised that the only reason SHEEHAN could give for making the telephone call was that he had been watching a television program on the subject of the assassination of President KENNEDY. According to Corporal O'BRIEN, SHEEHAN is "slow to develop". A copy of this information was forwarded to the Seattle Office.

<b>DETAILS OF INTERVIEWEE</b>			
<p>Reference is made to previous reports relative to Lee Harvey Oswald.</p> <p><b>Value Revolutionary</b></p> <p>On 11-26-63 the following was reported to SAIS Forrest V. Givens, by Bureau VIII, Dallas, Dallas Police Department:</p> <p>Lee Harvey Oswald, the FBI interview subsequent to his arrest, stated that he was visiting the Texas School Book Depository Building, the inn (as he called it) at which he had been staying, and was there to meet with a Communist or Secret Service Agent and asked for the location of a telephone.</p> <p>On 1-15-63 Mr. John Brink, Detective, Dallas Police Department, stated that he had interviewed Mr. James Anglin, Army Intelligence, who was trapped inside the Texas School Book Depository after the Depository doors were closed.</p> <p>On 1-15-63 Mr. John Brink, Detective, Dallas Police Department, relative to his interview of Mr. James Anglin, Army Intelligence, who was trapped inside the Texas School Book Depository after the Depository doors were closed, stated that he had been watching that person from a position near the corner of Main and Houston Streets, and that he had seen him go into the Texas School Book Depository and that he heard the state and he then joined a group of "Sherriff's" deputies, they were holding him near the east end of the Texas School Book Depository until information came in that he was wanted for the slaying of President Kennedy.</p>


