

Deposition - Miss MARGARET M. HENCHLIFFE, March 21, 1964, 6 H 139-43.

Questioning by Arlen Specter, Asst. Counsel, Warren Commission

Miss Henchcliffe is a nurse in the emergency room who helped with the President. She has had 12 years experience. On p.141 she names as doctors who were present some who I believe were not referred to in the report. Elsewhere there seem also to be the names of doctors not referred to in the report.

Miss Henchcliffe says she has had much experience with gunshot wounds and that the anterior neck wound was an entrance wound. She also said she had never seen an exit wound that looked like this one.

She was excused and about 3 minutes later, Specter recalled her to ask if she had any other information about gunshot wounds. She said someone, she couldn't remember who, had told her a fast bullet hitting only soft tissue might make an exit wound resembling an entrance wound in size. On p.143 during this period of questioning, she said of the Kennedy wound, "Well, it was just a small wound and wasn't jagged like most of the exit bullet wounds that I have seen."
