Dear Mr. Lesar:

By memorandum dated May 30, 1986, the FOI/PA unit of the FBI referred to us for appropriate processing a document originated by this Office which surfaced in a review of FBI files responsive to the FOI/PA request of your client, Harold Weisberg (#245,852). We understand that the FBI advised you of this referral by letter dated July 7, 1986.

Based on my review of this document, which, for your reference, bears FBI serial #62-117290-233, I have determined that it is exempt from mandatory release in that it is an intraagency communication. 5 USC 552 (b)(5). This document is not appropriate for discretionary release.

If you are dissatisfied with my action on this request, you may appeal from this denial by writing, within 30 days of your receipt of this letter, to the Office of Information and Privacy, U.S. Department of Justice, 10th and Constitution Avenue, N.W., Washington, D. C. 20530. Both the letter and the envelope should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Appeal." In the event you are dissatisfied with the results of any such appeal, judicial review will thereafter be available to you in the United States District Court for the judicial district in which you reside or have your principal place of business, or in the District of Columbia, which is also where the record you seek is located.
