MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION CONCERNING (SOVIET)

At approximately 12:25 a.m. 8-2-67 the Bureau Operator advised the writer that the operator for the Department of State switchboard, Philadelphia, wanted to put the Bureau in contact with an individual who claimed to have information concerning the assassination of President Kennedy. State Department operator wanted the extension number so she could put the call through direct. The call was referred to the writer who was advised that the caller was the wife of [REDACTED] (b)(7)(c)

[REDACTED] Massachusetts, telephone number, Area Code 215, [REDACTED]. The caller readily identified herself and after saying she had information concerning the assassination of President Kennedy started on a rambling story apparently covering her life, starting in 1927. She mentioned meeting [REDACTED] in 1943 and made reference to the fact that he had "affairs with Negro women." She spoke in a high-pitched emotional voice and on several occasions it was impossible to interrupt her to try to find out what she was talking about. At no time during the time she was on the telephone did she furnish any information concerning the assassination.

OBSERVATIONS:

Although Bureau indices have no record identifiable with captioned individual, it was quite obvious that she had no information to offer, therefore, further action is not warranted. In view of the manner in which she was able to contact the Bureau, this call is being made a matter of record and her name indexed. In the event other calls are received from her, it is suggested that a chronic complainant card be prepared.
