I went on a 2-year-active-duty stint as a member of the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve in the autumn of 1958 and was stationed at LTA, a subsidiary of El Toro Marine Base. It was there that I met Lee Harvey Oswald, in MACS-9, in the spring of 1959, having been transferred from MACS-4, the first squadron in which I served actively. In June of 1959 I went overseas to Atsugi, Japan, and served in MACS-1. I was returned to the States the next year and honorably discharged from active duty at the end of October, 1960.

For a few months I lived in Whittier, in an apartment near the campus of Whittier College with a roommate, [REDACTED] b6

I do not recall the street or number. In February I moved to New Orleans and first lived on [REDACTED]

Later, probably in the winter of 1962-1963, I moved into a building on the corner of Royal and Dumaine, and lived there until shortly before the Kennedy assassination -- after which I moved to an apartment on Dauphine Street, the other side of Esplanade from the Quarter, which was owned by a man whose first name was Francis, who was a close associate of Mr. Clay Shaw. [REDACTED]

On December 13th of 1963 I moved to Arlington, Virginia, and took up residence in Shirlington House, where I worked as a doorman for [REDACTED] b6
