Dear Alan,

What I have done makes inevitable that an effort be made to serve me. I would much prefer to be the plaintiff but that, seemingly, I cannot arrange because I cannot get counsel.

Unless it is sheer incompetence, I just cannot understand why they have not tried their local angles, like Jack Frazier, or a bookstore. If there were anything remotely resembling a left-wing one there, it would be Bringhler's pest.

If I can possibly arrange for a speech down there, anything that will pay the fare, I'll be there sooner than indicated, for there is also work to be done that I consider urgent.

There does seem to be a New Orleans man confined without court action or the assent of those responsible, at the demand of the Secret Service and for the 'security' of the President, the Warren Report to the contrary notwithstanding. I'll be his mother's guest when I am there, as I was last time.
