SYMOPSIS

Oswald alleged to have learned while in Merico City in the latter part of September, 1963, that there was a plot to assassinate Premier Castro of Cuba, and that President Kennedy had been advised of same.

DEPARTS OF THURSTIGATION

This inquiry originated in Mouston by Bocember 12, 1963 when Alongo World Andrews III, a reporter for the Mouston Post, savised the writer confidentially that he had received information from Felton West, the Houston Post Washington Burgen representative, to the exfect that civizens of the United States had entered into an agreement or a plot to assassing to Promier Costar of Onto and that Lee Harvey Oswald, who went to Merico City on September 20 and allegedly returned about Getober 1-3, learned of this plot, which infuriated him.

He stated that Oswald attempted to obtain a visa to Russia from the Russian Embassy and when he failed, contacted the Guban Embassy and attempted to arrange for a visa to Outs. He stated that the Outen Embassy was agreeable to giving him a visa but could not furnish one immediately which annoyed Oswald, cousing him to return to the States. He states that he has information that while in Mercico City Oswald learned of an contemplated plan to assassinate Casuro by unknown American citizens; and that then President Mennedy and Vice-President Johnson had been informed of this assassination plot.

Mr. Mackins inferred that this was a possible reason for Oswald assassinating the President.

Mr. Hudkins states he has received information that Oswald returned to Houston, according to an informant of his who will point out the house where Oswald visited, etc.

Hr. Hudkins refused to disclose the identity of his informant, but stated as soon as the name of the person Cowold visited was ascertained that this office would be furnished with the individual's name and address and it would be appearable for this Service to interview that individual.

He is evacive as to the undeveloped leads in Houston, but states that Folton West, Fost Mashington Bureau, has more specific information as to the plot to assassinate Castro and the fact that President Kennedy and Vice President Johnson were informed of same, by a former Cuban premier.

He stated it was agreeable for this Service to interview Felton West in Washington and use his name as a source of information.

Mr. Muddins is friendly to this Service and expressed a desire to assist this ? Service but requested that no information be disclosed to other agencies at this time.

UNDINELOPED LIFADS



If possible it is suggested that he not be made aware of the interview with Felton West.

The Houston office will develop any leads obtain from Mr. Hudkins of the Houston Post, in cornection with this information.

It is noted that the Houston Office of the CLA has no information as to the alleged plot to assassinate Premier Castro of Cuba.

MENORANDUM FOR FILE

Case No. CO-2-34030 Assassination of President Kennedy

Reference is made to the memorandum of SAIC Bertram of Mouston, dated December 14, 1963.

I located Pelton West, a Houston-Post, Washington Bureau Roppesentative and interviewed him in the office of SATO Behn. Mr. West has been on the Washington scene for approximately two years and spends a great deal of his time at the White House and at the Sonate Press Callery. He said categorically that he had no information concerning a flot to assassinate Control. He was of the opinion that no one at the Heuston-Post has any such information. He was informed that we were asking these questions at the suggestion of Alonso Madkins, whom he said he knew and that Hudkins had been working for the Houston-Post approximately 30 days and that Hudkins had worked for the Houston-Post at Dallas before and during the murder of Oswald by Ruby.

He stated that he was former City Editor of the Houston-Post and was in Dallas the day of the assassination. He said he had no information concerning the subject matter of Bertram's memorandum.

He was asked whether he had an employee in the Mouston-Post, Washington Bureau by the name of O'Leary. He said that Mr. O'Leary had been formerly Science Editor of the Mouston-Post but Mr. O'Leary, representing the Mouston-Post, had died in New Zealand while accompanying an Antarctic expedition, and that Mr. O'Leary was buried in Dallas some few days before the assassination of President Kennedy.

The results of the interview with West were phoned to SAIC Bertram; will follow-up on the information and further evaluate Mr. Ruckins' reliability as a source of information.

Assassination of President Kennedy

Reference made to memorandum report by this office dated 12/11/63, reporting interview with Alonzo H. Hudkins, III, a reporter for The Houston Post, a daily newspaper in Houston.

During the above interview Mr. Hudkins, who is personally known to the writer from Denver, Colorado, advised confidentially that George Butler, is Head of the Juvenile Division of the Dallas Police Department, is considered a "Rightest" very close to General Walker. Meadvised that soon after the death of President Mennedy he heard George Butler state, "I am glad the son-of-a-bitch is dead, but I wish it had not happened in Dallas," and other similar statements.

It is Mr. Hudkins' feeling that this type of statement and sentiment from responsible people is partly responsible for the unreasonable acts by part of the Dallas citizens.

Mr. Hudkins states that he considers George Butler a personal frieriand that if he is advised of the above statement, will immediately identify Mr. Hudkins as the informant. He, therefore, requests that his identity not be disclosed in any way to Butler.
