Tonight I had a chance to gaince at your 10/14/67 memo on the Butler-Cameld record and I was reminded of the analosures with the records when you sent them and of a recent copy of "Viblege Square" Gery sent. There he slipped and used the identification of "members of INCA" as those who "suggested" that if there had been an INCA in D lies the tragedy might have been everted. So, it is clear to me that he invented this. Anyway, the Village Square had an unoriginal piece.
