How I missed this the first time I went over CD87, I'll never known, unless it was so very early I didn't realize the significance of the address. However, we have have the answer we have wanted without drawing conclusions and completely, I believe, puncturing the DJ posture of "investigative file" or any other excuse for withholding the pemphlet Quigley got 8/9/63.

The copy of the Gerrets-Rice report dated 12/4/63 is so unclear in this file (Folder 3), on most pages the control number cannot be made out. The synopsis indicates more than the Lamont pamphlet bore the 544 address:"other such literature bore the rubber stemp impression ' F P C C 544 Camp St., New Orleans, La."

Page 2:"Lt. Dyer also advised that a small booklet which had been seized from Oswald and which bore the title 'The Crime Against Suba' bore the following rubber stamp impression: 'F P C C 544 Camp St',"etc

(NOte also LHO gave the PO the wrong Murret address, by one number, rather typical.)

(Note N.O. police had "Oswald's FEI number", that is, "327 925 D", page 3.)

Page 4:"Lt. Dyer stated that David William Ferrie, whose name came up during the course of this investigation at New Orleans and on whom a separate report will be submitted, is the owner of an airplane...." Now I do not recall this as one of the released Ferrie documents. Please correct me if 1 am wrong. Therefore, we have an added reason for the suppression, on both scores.

At the bottom of this page also the pamphlet bore the 544 address. The pretense of an investigation of this address, that undoubtedly was well-known to the FBI and should have been to the SS, is presented this way: Every effort is being made to determine whether the FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE ever occupied dpsce in the building located at this address." They knew. And they knew who did.

To both, this is so indistinct copying is not satisfectory. I suggest one of you write for a copy of Control 449 from a different files. It must be filed elsehwere. This is a remote generation. I cannot find my list of Ferrie documents, classified and released. Perhaps it is in the copy for 0 in NO. I'd appreciate a copy of this if either of you has it and a copy of the suppressed document, I think from 75, I sent both of you after finding it in Tom's transcript tion in N.O. That is one of the things we are to sue for. I'd like to include this. ¹ hope that regardless of the status of his own efforts, Paul will agree to this, for getting this kind of thing before a court, where witnesses can be exemined, I think is very important. If you agree, please update me or give me a new set of what you have so I can give it to Bud. Then I will merely make my general request to ^vinson last year more specific in renewing it to the new AG. We've got them over a barrel of this now.

I urge you to keep this entirely to yourselves, for there is no one else working on this, no one else for whom the knowledge represents any value, and 1 want to surprise them.

Y. He also said that some of the leaflets which were found in Oswald's possession bore the name of "A. J. HIDTIL P. O. Dox 30015 MEN ORLEANS, LA."

It. Eyer also advised that a small booklet which had been seised from Oswald and which bore the title "The Grim' Against Cuba" bore the following rubber stamp impression: " F P C C 5hh CAMP Er., NEW GRIEANS, LA."

Lt. Byer stated that he would be happy to furnish our Service with copies of the verices pamphlets, booklets, etc., which had been seized from Oswald at the time of his arrest on 8-9-63.

He was informed that at the first opportunity a representative of this Service would call upon aim in person, and discuss this matter with him.

At 3:00 P. M. on 11-23/63 reporting agent telephonically inquired of Postel Inspector J. J. Zarze, New Orleans, as to Post Office Box 30016, New Orleans. Inspector Zarza stated that the correct number of this Post office Box is 30051. He stated that this box is located in the Zafayette Square Staticn, which in turn is located on the first floor of the Old Pederdl Building 600 South Street, this being the building in which our office is located. He said that this box was rented on 6-3-63 to L. H. Osmald, 657 French Street, New Orleans, Le.; that Trench Street is located in the Lakeview section of New Orleans but that there is no such address as #657 grench Street" in New Orleans. (It is believed that this address should be <u>757</u> grench Street, which is the address of Mr. and Mrs. Ch. Les F. Murrett, uncle and aunt of Lee Mirvey Camald). Inspector Zarze stated that the EI has the original application for tals Post Office Hex, it having been turned over to an FBI Agent on 11-23-63 who was concueting an investigation with reference to Lee Hervey Gewald. Inspector Zarze for the auvised that the persons designated by Oswald to receive mail in this Post office box here: A. J. Hidell and Maring Oswald.

At 3:15 P. M. on 11-23-63 reporting sgent contacted the New Orleans Police Department, Bureau of Identification, and spoke with Technician Anthony Guardana, with request that he check very carefully for a record on A. J. Hidell or Hydell. Hr. Evanding later informed me that no record of anyone by the name of Hideli or Hydell could be found in the indices of the Bureau of Identification. Reporting agent has had the records of the New Orleans Police Department, Butcas of Identification, checked coveral times since 11-23-63, but in each instance the a policy making the check of the indices reported that no record could be found of anyone named Hideli or Hydell.

Numerous persons interviewed during this investigation have stated that they did not know of anyone named A. J. Hidell or similar name.

On the afternoon of 11-27-63 SATO John W. Rice and reporting event interviewed Lt. Paul Dyer, Intelligence Unit, New Orleans Police Reportment. we exhibited his file on Lee Harvey Oswald, which reflected Oswald's FBI number to be 327 925 D. The file reflected that Oswald had been in the U. S. Marin. Corps, his serial number with the DEMO being shown as 1653230. Oswald was shown to have been on active duty from 10-20-50 through 9-11-59. With reference to this period of enlistment horwas shown to have received an honorable discharge.

The Intelligence Unit's file showed Oswald's date and place of birth as 10-10-39 at New Orleans, Le. No was shown to be 5'9" tall and to have weighed 140 lbs. as of 0-9-63. As of 0-9-63 Oswald was shown to have been unamployed about three tracks. It uss shown that he had worked for the Luzianne Coffee Company (um. B. Weily & 00., Ital.) for about three months. It was also shown that he had worked in Fort Worth for a sizet metal company for several months.

15. Uper stated that when interviewed subsequent to his arrest at New Orleans on -0-7-63, Osweld was evasive as to his prior personal history or background.

Consid's wile's name was shown as Marina Press and he was shown to have been surrisd in Fort Worth, Texas. Oswald was shown as having two brothers - Robert Jowald, age 27, and John Develd, age 32. His father, reportedly deceased, was shown to have been named John Lee Oswald. His nother's name was shown as Marguorite ______ Gewald bort Morth, Texas, no street address being shown. It was indicated that she hive alone.

Oswald is said to have denied to the police that the FAIR FLAY FOR CUEN CUENTIFIE was Communist or a Communist front, and to have also denied that he (Cruic) was a Communist.

Lt. Dyor stated that when arrested on 8-9-63 at New Orleans Cauald had in his possession two cards as follows:

- (1) National Lembership Card LLTR FLAY FOR OFDA COMPUTER issued 5-28-63. President's mane as shown on card: "V. T. LEE, National Organization - 799 Ercaduay, New York 3, N. Y."
- (2) Local Mambership Card N. C. Chapter FAIR PLAY FOR CURA COMMETTER, dated 5-6-63. President: A. Midell.

Lt. Dyer indicated that subsequent to his arrest on 8-9-63 Oswald had been interviewed by Sgt. Horace 4. Austin and Path. Marren Roberts, both of whom were at that time assigned to the Intelligence Unit. Path. Warren Roberts is reported to be prosently assigned to duty at the First District Police Station, New Orleans.

Lt. Eyer also surrendered a photostatic copy of an application for membership in The Fair Play for Cube Condittee, New Orleans, La. The name and address "A J HILELL P. O. Box 50016 MTM ORIGINS, LA." appeared on this blank application form. He also surrendered two photostatic copies of a circular titled "The Truth about Cuba IS IN CUTA1", published by the FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COLUTION, 799 Broadway, New York 3, M. Y. These papers had been taken from Oswald at the time of his arrest on 8-9-63 at Her Orleans.
