After typing the enclosed note on CD 131:2, it suddenly seemed familiar. I checked and find I have it but filed it without amking any analysis or notes, I do not know how long ago. So, Idecided to make a brief, quick check on 'swald's service record. His assignments are 198658. Immediately after his Jacksonville basic, as I'd suspected, there it is but there it an't. The next two items read: "CAS TO EMEN HOMO. The dates are not exactly as in the FBI report, the beginning date being two days later, may 4 rather than may 2. The ending date is in both cases identical, June 19.

This is a deceptive record. It makes no reference to either a school of a post or anything like that, while Keesler is, I believe, an air Force post, and ne was a Marine, this one seems to indicate his assignment was neadquarters Battalion (M2 M3) of the Marine Corp meadquarters (M2 M3MC) I'd rether not guess on CASCO, but it could be communications air school company. Under 'Primary Puty' is DUINS', again I do not know, but is it stretching too far to take the ending, INS, to be an abbreviation for Intelligence School? Shades of Davison: P. 662 lists this as A c & W Opr course, and confirms Keesler is an AFB. 665, no "administrative remarks" relevant.

Most of the file deals with the discharges. But on p. 753 is the cryptic form for OSWEAD (sic) that says this was an direct arming and control School in which he was 7th in a class of 30. And the next page indicates the class was convened 4/24/57, when he was still in Jacksonville. 756 names five others with him, not the nome of the FBI r port. his position of 46th in a class of 54 at Jax (757) would hardly seem to be a usual basis for ac action f for the more advanced training.

This is but a hastyx examination of the Folson exhibit. It is enough to cast doubt on the purposes of the FBI report and to leave no loubt of its error. Thy it was needed to begin with is also a question, on why it was a stricted to this very short part of his milotary career is still enother.

But let us supposed that it suddenly appeared to someone that this might have been an out of the ordinary Marine, perhaps an egent of sole kind, and it was desired to learn what the records eight show bearing on this. The only item from that long record relates to Keesler, where I cannot rove it but I do believe certain extra skills and techniques are taught. This FBI report on what is available in the depot is reassurance that the skip deem't show.

and in the course of getting it, the FBI establishes that the supposedly full file on "sweld's marine history is not full, not complete.

Incidently, the guy he was suspected of Laving killed is one of the six referred to above. Shannd.

I think Jim's telents could well be spent in this area and I'd certainly like to have enything that might turn up for GENT OSWALD.

To begin with, note that the records are, by this time, not originals at the depot, they are "a photostatic copy" of the one thing. But that is the depot for all records—and all were obtained. Why the interest in this single one? Why did the "personnel" have to "advise"? Cen't FBI agents read? For what purpose did SA Lewis go there—this single record? Then what does the report not say he has a copy and forwards it with the report? Is it possible there are other things to be avoided?

I'd appreciate it if Jim coull take time to check the published and allegedly complete herine record to see if this is in it and if it is, what else the record shows. I do believe, if possible, this should be carried further. I should like to use it in ACENT OSWALD and for this prupose, when it is not inconvenient, I'd appreciate an actual-size copy.

This is too out of the ordinary, even in what in this case is ordinary, to ignore or to assume it is that special FBI dictionary and nothing else that tittilates. With the interview, dictation and typing all the same day, it is possible this was a phoned interview. But it is also a reflection of someone saying "quickly". Hw
