Agnew Says He's Divisive, But 'Positive'

EL PASO, Oct. 5-Vice President Spiro T. Agnew admitted tonight that he was a

mitted tonight that he was a devisive influence in Ameri-can politics—but a positive divisive influence. Agnew, in a speech pre pared for delivery at a dinner in honor of Republican Sen John Tower of Texas, criti cized what he called "a pomp ous, unelected liberal elite" in the United States. He said this group alleged that "dividing the American people has been my main con tribution to the national politi cal scene since assuming the office of vice president over 2½ years ago."

Agnew said, "So that there can be no misunderstanding about my feelings on this sub ject, I not only plead guilty to this charge but I am some what flattered by it."
