## Agnew Foresees New Left Defeat

ATLANTA, June 19 (AP)—Vice President Agnew warned today that the "elitists of the New Left and their renegade followers" are due for a shakeup in the November election.

"I have no doubt, ladies and gentlemen, that when the voters' decision is rendered in November, there will be a shakeup," he said.

"But it won't be the system that gets it," he said. "It will be the elitists of the New Left and their renegade followers who seek revolutionary change in the basic institutions and concepts which have made this republic the envy and the hope of the world."

Agnew spoke to the national convention of the U.S. Jaycees amid tight security.

The downtown Atlanta Civic Center where he spoke to an estimated 4,000 persons was picketed by about 130 antiwar demonstrators.

The demonstrators, marching beneath a Vietcong flag, walked back and forth in front of the center under the eyes of about 50 helmeted policemen.

Several of the demonstrators wore death masks and shrouds. There were no arrests. A policeman said the death masks violated a Georgia law against wearing masks in public.

"We're overlooking it today,

because we want to create no commotion with a bunch of arrests while the Vice President is here," he said.

Agnew received a tumultuous reception inside the Civic Center. Jaycees stood on chairs and waved signs which said, "Keep the Veep," and "Agnew in '72."

Agnew was substituting for President Nixon, who was forced to cancel his scheduled address to the convention. About 18,000 Jaycees and their wives are attending the convention.
