I am obtaining a copy of the pardon of President Nixon for you. I am also contacting the Justice Department to see if it is possible to obtain the charges against Vice President Agnew. Since these charges were dropped when he resigned they may never have been formally filed and may not be available. I will let you know as soon as I have a reply to my inquiry.

I am informed by the National Archives that the letter of resignation of former Vice President Agnew can not be found. This letter was sent to the Secretary of State, as required by law, and the State Department is now unable to find this letter.
