Dear Gary,

Yesterday a man who said he is a friend of yours and whose name I did not catch (I'm having tests Friday to see if new hearing aids are indicated) phoned to ask me about what ^{now} is not impossible for ~~op~~, searching the records I got from the FBI on the rifle testing. I suggested to him that as an alternative he file a FOIA request of the FBI for that information, told him how to do that and suggested how he phrase his request for those test results. After we spoke I thought he should also use the word "examinations" in his request. But I do not know who he is or how to reach him.

Thinking about it further this morning I would urge caution on him before he says anything publicly along the line of what he indicated to me, that 399 was not fired from that rifle because the M-C rifles all had four grooves only. He may be quite right, but at the same time it seems not to make sense to deposit a bullet to be found that would not trace back to that rifle. And being ~~able~~ to trace it is Oswald is the means by which a link to Oswald was made.

I did not think at the time he called to suggest to him that he read the testimony of SA Robert Frazier. Frazier gave the Commission its testimony on that rifle and that bullet. He may then have testified to the number of grooves.
