Please excuse my folding of the enclosed. It is early in the morning, I'll mail this when I leave early and save a day, and I do not want to wake my wife to locate any larger envelopes.

By coincidence, <sup>as</sup> I tried to indicate to you, when you phoned we had a pleasant visit from a retired FBI SA and his wife, rather nice people and among the few of them who do not agree with the official mythology. Because of my impaired hearing I use a speakerphone. So he was interested in our conversation and impressed by the way we share information.

As I recall that ~~was~~ other report by Rrazier what I had was about three pages limited to the car with better illustrations of that dispersal and of the damage to the windshield to which I suggest you pay close attention. Because I believe that Kellerman's head whether or not Connally's body may have been between it and JFK's head.

This retired SA also seemed impressed, especially when I told him what time it was when you were, that a busy doctor would use his car phone (and it was much clearer than a later call from Pittsburgh on an in-place phone) had such an interest.

We were both amused that while driving and using your phone you could also turn the pages of NEVER AGAIN!

If you want clearer picture of the tie and evidences that it was untied and retied I was able to make them through a lawsuit take pictures of it for me but they lied to deny me copies. I had no interest in blood and Burke Marshall was unresponsive and did not tell them to give me copies. But they are at the Archives and he can tell them to give them to you. The Archives can give you their letter to me that I cannot begin to search for in so vast a file and in the basement to which I now have no access in which they confess that when they for the first time looked at the tie it was again unknotted so they could not take a picture of the knot for me. If Marshall agrees, please get a set of those pix for me for file. You will also find in them that the shirt was made for JFK by "Charles of New York" and that unlike the pictures of it taken for the Commission in which the shirt seems to have a single rather broad stripe in the pattern it is in fact stripes made of three individual stripes. I think it will be effective in your writing to be able to point out how professionally unprofessional the FBI's pix were. As with source I aid in III.
