The concluding manines is of more than pessing interest:

I suggest these might be worth examining, perhaps a xorox rather than the more costly glossies of the pictures. And now interesting it would be if either or both are missing:

There is a clear inference, i celieve, that " knew or had back of other cases, vir his last contence, "have you only names to add to the list". This can be taken as careful phrasing. He opens not by saying there are these cases of people being taken for Dawald but that these are "known by name". How many not "known by heme" but still known to have existed? We know of a number.

It seems not unfair to suggest tust what Criffin was really doing here is not investigating, seeking these who may have posed as LHO, but anguged in defensive activity, closing gave and answering reactions before they were asked.
