

EXPIRING STATUTES

The Department asked for our views concerning a request from the Bureau of the Budget to list statites and provisions in statutes which, by their terms, will terminate within the next several years unless extended by legislation. The Department also asked for recommendations as to whether the expiring legislation should be extended.

Except for appropriation bills, only one statute in which he Bureau has a direct interest appears to be pertinent. Public Law 89-318, passed November 2, 1965, authorized the Attorney General to determine which items of evidence pertaining to the assassination of President Kennedy should be acquired and preserved by the United States. Under this statute, when the Attorney General made such a determination . If rights, title, and interest in and to that item was to be vested in the United States upon publication of that fact in the Federal Register.

The statute, by its terms, declared that the authority granted was to expire one year from the date of enactment. Therefore, the provisions of this law will remain in effect until November 2, 1966, unless extended.

Renewal of this authority is not recommended as the statute appears to have served its intended purpose. In addition, certain items acquired by the United States in connection with the investigation of the assassination have been held in the custody of this Bureau and extension could possible create more custodial burdens of a similar nature.
