Dear Mr. Weisberg,

I know that you are very busy, but, I think that this ^{that is} is important what I'm going to tell you. Enclosed is a self-addressed stamped envelope.

On page 40 frames 253-254 of the 26 volumes of testimony, which I have, the third (3) man in the car is plainly visible. Also in the November 29, 1963 issue of Life magazine on page 24 the 11th frame the third man in the car is also visible. He is wearing dark-glasses and has gray hair. I wish you would bring this out in one of your future books.

Now, a very serious thing is in the 26 volumes. I have proof that J.F.K. is alive. Now, don't shrug this off. In volume 17 page 470-71 near the bottom the following

appears, quote:

"Are you enroute to Love Field?
Yes, but don't put it on the air. 1:17 P.M.
I got a state unit going southwest
airmotive to pick up.....

We have information that someone
to pick ~~up~~ the governor's wife up.
Don't let any cars follow us into
the field.

Dear Mr. Alloway,

I am, actually, too busy. I'm finishing up the fifth book now, but I answer in haste.

Were you able to examine the slides and the Zap movie, I am confident you would agree there is no unaccounted for person in the car. I have spent hours examining these pictures. There is distortion in print, with the dots that are part of the photographic process. I have blown these frames up to more than four feet in width and have not seen what you see.

The radio logs are wrong on Mrs. Connally. I tracked that down several years ago and have forgotten the whole story. There was another important personage who did arrive then and the dispatcher confused the two.

Thank you for your good wishes. I doubt if we will be able to afford to publish the documentation to Oswald in New Orleans right now because it is beyond our financial capacity. It is my hope that Bantam, which is doing a cheap edition of the book, will do well enough with it to persuade them to do it standard size, on good paper and with the entire appendix. If they do this, we will probably send a notice to everyone on our list. However, that will be a much more costly book than the one that will be out soon.
