MR. CHAIRMAN AND MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE:

YOU HAVE HEARD FROM ME ONCE TODAY SO I PROPOSE TO MAKE MY VALEDICTORY REFORT THIS AFTERNOON QUITE BRIEF.

IN DEFERENCE TO YOUR VERY HEAVY AGENDA, I SHALL REFRAIN

FROM ANY REVIEW OF THE PAST BUSY YEAR BECAUSE THAT WILL BE

COVERED IN THE SEPTEMBER ISSUE OF THE JOURNAL. AND I AM CONTENT

TO LEAVE TO OTHERS AND TO TIME ANY EVALUATION OF THE TOTAL WORK

OF THE ASSOCIATION DURING MY STEWARDSHIP.

ſ I WILL SAY ONLY THAT NO ONE COULD HAVE TRAVELED THE EQUIVALENT OF AT LEAST TEN TIMES AROUND THE WORLD IN THE PAST TWO YEARS, AS I HAVE, AND HAVE MADE WELL OVER 200 SPEAKING APPEARANCES BEFORE BAR GROUPS AND MANY OTHER AUDIENCES WITHOUT COUNTING IT AN EXTRAORDINARY EXPERIENCE. IT HAS REINFORCED MY CONVICTION THAT LAWYERS GENERALLY ARE CONCERNED WITH SOCIAL AND PROFESSIONAL AFFAIRS; ARE ESSENTIALLY HONEST AND HARDWORKING Ć · · • · · • WITH A DESIRE TO DO GOOD, BEYOND THAT OF MOST GROUPS IN OUR SOCIETY, AND THAT THEY ARE COMMITTED TO A MATTER-OF-FACT . ADHERENCE TO HIGH ETHICAL AND MORAL STANDARDS. CERTAINLY I CAN ENDORSE WITHOUT RESERVATION HARRY TWEED'S FAMOUS DICTUM ABOUT THE PLEASURES OF BEING IN THE COMPANY OF LAWYERS -- NOW EVEN MORE SO BECAUSE OF THE LARGER NUMBERS OF LADIES IN OUR GROUP. Ę

YET I WOULD HAVE TO CONCEDE THAT, BECAUSE OF RECENT EVENTS INVOLVING LAWYERS IN HIGH PLACES IN THE GREATEST POLITICAL SCANDAL IN THE HISTORY OF OUR COUNTRY, WHAT YOU AND I KNOW TO BE TRUE ABOUT THE RECTITUDE OF MOST OF OUR COLLEAGUES AT THE BAR IS NOT ACCEPTED AS TRUE BY A LARGE SEGMENT OF THE AMERICAN PEOPLE. THERE CAN BE LITTLE DOUBT THAT THE PRESTIGE OF OUR PROFESSION HAS SUFFERED A SERIOUS BLOW BY THE DISCLOSURES OF WATERGATE.

WHICH BRINGS ME TO THE FIRST OF TWO POINTS I WANT TO MAKE IN THIS REPORT:

THE FIRST IS THAT WE CANNOT, AND WE MUST NOT, FAIL TO RESPOND TO THIS CHALLENGE. WITHOUT PREJUDGING THE GUILT OF ANYONE, THE LEAST WE CAN DO TO RIGHT -- IN THE PUBLIC EYE -- THE GREAT WRONGS OF THE LAWYERS, IF ANY, WHO HAVE BETRAYED THEIR PROFESSIONAL OBLIGATIONS OR VIOLATED THE CRIMINAL LAWS

IS TO LEND OUR EFFORTS TO SEE TO IT THAT PROMPT AND APPROPRIATE

DISCIPLINARY ACTION IS TAKEN BY THE PROFESSION AND THE COURTS.

I AM CONFIDENT THIS WILL BE DONE; New York Already has

DISBARRED ONE LAWYER AND I AM TOLD THAT OTHER STATES HAVE BEGUN INVESTIGATIONS AS TO OTHERS. BUT I WOULD URGE YOU IN THIS HOUSE, WHO ARE THE CHOSEN LEADERS OF THE BAR IN YOUR JURISDICTIONS, TO

EXERT YOUR PERSONAL INFLUENCE TO THAT END IN EVERY STATE IN

WHICH RESPONSIBILITY FOR PROFESSIONAL ACTION MAY LIE.

AND WHILE THE WATERGATE AFFAIR IS FOREMOST NOW IN THE

PUBLIC MIND I AM NOT SUGGESTING IT IS THE ONLY SITUATION IN

WHICH A GREATER CONCERN ABOUT DISCIPLINE IS NEEDED. OUR SELF-

POLICING RESPONSIBILITY NEEDS TO BE PURSUED MORE VIGOROUSLY ON EVERY FRONT IF WE ARE TO BE TRUE TO OURSELVES. WE CANNOT EQUIVOCATE ON THIS ISSUE IF WE VALUE PUBLIC CONFIDENCE AND THE

RIGHT TO CONTINUE POLICING OUR OWN RANKS.

AT THE PRESENT TIME THIS ASSOCIATION IS ACTIVATING THE NATIONAL CENTER FOR PROFESSIONAL DISCIPLINE AUTHORIZED BY THIS HOUSE AT THE MIDYEAR MEETING. ITS FUNCTION WILL BE TO ENCOURAGE AND ASSIST THE STATE AND LOCAL BAR DISCIPLINARY AGENCIES TO IMPROVE THEIR PERFORMANCE AND INVESTIGATIVE RESOURCES, AND TO PROVIDE TECHNICAL GUIDANCE AND SUPPORT.

THAT NEW FACILITY CAN AND WILL BE OF SOME AID IN THE UPGRADING OF DISCIPLINARY PROGRAMS CALLED FOR IN THE CLARK COMMITTEE REPORT OF THREE YEARS AGO, A PROCESS NOW GOING ON. BUT IT IS NOT THE TOTAL ANSWER TO THE PROBLEM WE FACE, BY ANY

MEANS. THE ABA HAS NO DISCIPLINARY AUTHORITY, AS YOU KNOW;

THE AUTHORITY TO INITIATE AND CARRY OUT INVESTIGATIONS RESTS

WITH THE STATES IN WHICH OFFENDING LAWYERS WERE LICENSED TO

THIS IS NOT ANOTHER WATERGATE INQUIRY, BUT AN EFFORT ON

THE PART OF THIS ASSOCIATION TO EXPLORE MEANS BY WHICH THE JUSTICE DEPARTMENT AND RELATED PROSECUTORIAL ARMS OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT CAN BE BETTER INSULATED FROM PARTISAN INFLUENCES -- OR ANY OTHER INFLUENCES -- WHICH MAY BE ALIEN TO THEIR INDEPENDENCE AND OBJECTIVITY IN THE ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE. You realize as I do that the members of the House will deal with a calendar that comprises an array of important issues concerned with the ongoing work of this great Association. I say this in view of one published suggestion that we drop all scheduled work and devote the entire annual meeting to a consideration of Watergate. While I regard Watergate as important, as I have already said, I really am at a loss to understand the suggestion both because I am sure we have no
