Attached are two different copies of a Not Recorded Serial from the 62-103090
file. The record is a/legat, Mexico, airtel to Director of 8/4/64
One copy is stamped as classified by 2040 on 6/27/77, the ~~xxx~~ ^{TI} other does not have the
classification stamp. Both have the same excisions.

The record was not classified prior to 6/27/77 despite a number of prior
reviews.

The excisions of the FBI. were not observed.

Moreover, I doubt that if the airtel content ever was any kind of "national
security" information it still qualified for classification at the time it was first
classified.

The subject matter is the visit of the president of the American War Association
and the committee extended by the FBI.

AWA pro-Idemia and their associates were selected by the Warren Commission to
represent the interests of the dead Oswald. Therefore any information of this
nature is relevant, particularly because the AWA people did nothing to represent
