Dear Mr. Schaener:

I am writing you on a matter of utmost importance. The authoritative <u>Congressional Quarterly</u>, a political news digest, recently summed it up: "The shape of elective politics in the United States for the entire decade of the 1970's will be influenced strongly by what happens in this year's elections."

What happens in your state of Minnesota, and around the country this year could well depend on how you answer my letter now, Mr. Schaener.

Let me explain. I recently called an emergency meeting in Washington of conservative leaders to discuss a frightening report that had just been completed by the American Conservative Union (ACU) staff.
