Alice Patler, 24, told Arlington police Wednesday night that a man she identified as Christopher Vidnjevich, 25, fired there shots at her as she entered the back door of her home at 2522 Lee hwy. shortly after 7 p.m.

Police found no evidence and Mrs. Patler swore out a warrant charging Vidnjevich with assault with intent to do bodily harm.

Vidnjevich, against Patler in his murder trial a year ago, surrendered Wednesday night after being contacted by police.

At the hearing yesterday, four party members said Vidnejevich was sorting literature at party headquarters at the time of the alleged shooting.

Before dismissing the assault charge, Judge Thomas

the latest in a series of clashes reported between Patler and his family and members of Rockwell's group, now known as the National Socialist

White People's Party.
Vidnjevich, listed at 6365 N. Nottingham st., McLean, was convicted earlier this year in Maine of shooting at a witness who testified for Patler.

Patler, 30, is free on \$40,000 bond while appealing his firstdegree murder conviction. He was given a 20-year sentence.
