Dear Bob,

I believe it was Pat with whom I discussed the brochure you want me to get up. She was to send me a draft of those things you'd like included, so I'd know, from your experience, what should be. As soon as I get this I will make a draft, with layout, and send it for your approval and suggestions. I have already discussed it with my artist. Would you also, please, include a few samples from those you now have? He asks for them.

Many of you people seem to believe slides are desirable. Therefore, in addition to those I had, I am having some made of new material and I will have an ample supply, should you think they should be used or should an audience want them. These will be of people and of evidence.

I have been thinking of this since meeting you. I think it is not only possible but desirable to talk of things entirely new, entirely unknown. I am loaded with such material from my limited editions and will use them. This can broaden your possibilities to include medical and legal groups. I have completed two parts of the three-part study of the autopsy. All of this is new. It is material, for example, Mark Lane could not have used.

Perhaps the best current possibilities deal with the King/Ray case. Here again I have written the only book on that evidence, and I have made the only analysis of that evidence. This might have special appeal to some black and liberal groups, especially at colleges. I can talk about the King murder entirely, with no reference to JFK's.
