She advised that since November 25, 1963, she has been seanchims "LNDREVS" of ice for a record of CLAY BERTRAND and has been unable to locate this name. She advised that CLEY BRRTRAMD is ant known to her.
EVA SPRINCZR advised she does mot reca.11 LEE HARVEY OSWALD as a client of DESH ANDEEWS amd has no record of pith at the office. She recalls ANDRRWS speaking to her briefly about someone being interested in chancing a discharge from. the Marine Corps but is unable to associate this conversation with any recollection of OSWALD.
