DA Seeking to Get Warren Lawyer for Andrews Trial

The District Attorney's office took steps today to have a Warren Commission attorney brought to New Orleans to testify next week at the perjury trial of attorney Dean Andrews.

Andrews told a commission attorney, Wesley J. Liebier, when questioned under oath in 1964 that a man named Clay Bertrand had called him after the assassination of President Kennedy and asked him to defend accused assassin Lee Harvey Oswald.

District Attorney John Gibson, in his probe of the assassination, has identified a fired New Orleans hoodlum, Clay L. Shaw, who used the alias Clay Bertrand, as participating in a conspiracy to murder the President.

ANDREWS, WHO HAS AN unblemished record, is a former partner of the late James Vernon Grand Jury member Clay Shaw and Bertrand are not the same man. Geseley was asked to come to New Orleans voluntarily

and testify August and August 10, and he refused.

Today, assistant DA James L. Alcock filed a request for

attendance by Liebier with District Judge Frank G. Slaughter who presides at the trial of Andrews. Judge Slaughter signed an order for Liebier's return and an order for funds to cover Liebier's travel expenses.

The name of the forwarder to the Warren Commission is now being investigated, which is in Wadham County.

IN REQUESTING Liebier's return to New Orleans, Alcock said that he is necessary as a material witness in the state case against Andrews. He said that Liebier was asked to sign the grand jury's questioning of Andrews and to make a sworn statement.

ANDREWS WAS questioned by the Warren Commission in 1964 during its investigation of the Kennedy assassination.

He gave a commission in 1964 a conflicting description of the man he said called him Clay Bertrand. He said the real grand jury member Clay Shaw was not the man he said called him Bertrand. "I can't say he is Clay Bertrand," Andrews said that the man he knew as Clay Bertrand was French Quarter bar-owner Eugene Davis. Davis has denied using the name.
