

NEW ORLEANS—
(UPI)— A five-man jury early today found attorney Dean Andrews Jr. guilty of perjury in connection with District Attorney James Garrison's investigation of the Kennedy assassination.

Amirews was accused of lying to the grand jury investigating the assassination last March when he said he could not say whether it was Clay L. Shaw, using the name Clay bertrand, who phoned and asked him to represent Lee Harvey Oswald in Dallas.

Andrews showed no emotion when the verdict was announced.

FIRST TRIAL

Andrews was the first person to be tried in connection with Garrison's investigation.

Shaw, charged win conspiring to kill President Kennedy, is the next to be tried. His trial probably will begin in September or October.

Andrews faces up to five years in prison.

Under Louisiana law, bond cannot be posted prior to sentencing.
