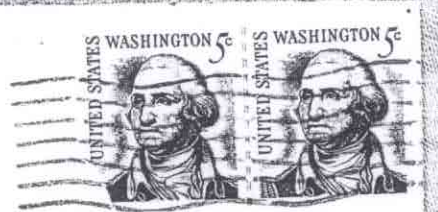
Dear Mr. Wiseberg,
