I've just gotten back from vacation and have come across your letter of July 25 which Paul acknowledged in my absence.

First, we have had a check made with respect to the father and son whose name you mentioned from Metairie, Louisiana and we find that we have absolutely nothing in our files on them.

Secondly, I don't believe I got a letter but I am not sure. Certainly I got nothing asking whether totals exist on synagogue desecrations and bombings and attacks on rabbis and other Jews beginning January 1, 1964. I'll check with our research people and give you whatever information they have on that. I do have a vague recollection of some kind of totaling having been done sometime ago.

Third, I am interested in that other matter you mentioned in either a note or a telephone message. I would appreciate it, therefore, if you could call me collect at my office here this Friday. Our number is 689-7400. Our code is 212.

I am very sorry that we couldn't get together when we were in Washington. But I was so damned busy with the various aspects of the Commission Meeting that I didn't get a free moment to even return your call. And since then it has been a continuous rat race.

I am delighted to hear that you and Lil are both well though I am sorry to learn that the weight of the continuous work is showing. Somehow or other it seems to me that both of
