

Dear Mr. Edgington,

Thanks you for your card of the 9th. You report referral of my information request to the Archives and AFIP, for which I also thank you.

I wrate to ask that you also include the proper part of the Military District of Washington because it was involved and has information relating to such things as the providing of guards, perhaps only honor guards, possibly a casket, and arrangements for transporting the corpse and casket(s).

MDW was represented at Netherda Navy Hospital and at Andrews Field. In addition, its commanding general was at the autopsy and I believ was also present to be aware of all details he was required to know so he could handle the arrangement that would be MDW(s responsibility.

In response to my requests of years earlier I was told that the Army had destroyed its other records pertaining to the assassination and its investigation. Since then there have been several official investigations. I ask if as a result of them any records originally reported to have been destroyed were located. If so I still have the interests that led to my requests of years ago.
