

# JFK Memorialized in Dallas and D.C.

Memorial services were held yesterday in Dallas and in the nation's capital on the ninth anniversary of President John F. Kennedy's assassination.

In Dallas, the scene was the Kennedy Memorial, a few hundred yards from where President Kennedy was shot as he rode in a motorcade Nov. 22, 1963. Mayor Wes Wise of Dallas enlisted the help of school children for the service.

In Washington, there was a private Mass at the Holy Trinity Church in Georgetown, where President Kennedy used to live. The service was for close friends and family members.

A visit to the Kennedy grave at Arlington National Cemetery outside Washington on the anniversary has been an annual event for the Kennedy family.

Its most prominent members, the late President's brother, Sen. Edward M. Kennedy (D-Mass.), his mother, Rose Kennedy and Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis, were not expected to be present.

Sen. Kennedy and his family are in West Germany and Mrs. Onassis has never joined the Kennedys to honor her late husband on the anniversary of his death. Mrs. Kennedy is vacationing in Florida.

Mrs. Hugh Auchincloss,

mother of Kennedy's widow, Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis, arrived at the cemetery shortly after 8 a.m. She knelt before the grave where she

placed blue and white flowers. A light snow, Washington's first of the new season, was falling at the time.

Another visitor, Evelyn Lin-

dent Kennedy was not as personal secretary, deposited bouquet of roses at the grave

Scores of tourists were hand. A few brought flowers.
