Noting that next Nov. 22 will be the 10th anniversary of the assassination of President Kennedy in Dallas as well as Thanksgiving Day, Representative Bertram L. Podell said Thanksgiving should be celebrated, instead, on Nov. 29. The Brooklyn Democrat introduced a bill that would move Thanksgiving to Nov. 29 in any year that it coincided with the Kennedy anniversary. "The memory of the Kennedy tragedy would cast a pall over the holiday, which, for many Americans, would greatly diminish their enjoyment of Thanksgiving," said Mr. Podell. "And it would perpetuate a needless burden on a family with more than its share of sad memories."
