# After 25 years, 'outpouring of love' JFK recalled across the nation

Scores of people across the USA, and members of the Kennedy family, paid tribute to John F. Kennedy Tuesday on the 25th anniversary of his assassination.

At Dallas' Dealy Plaza, thousands of people brought flowers and offered silent prayers.

"We are here because this is an important place in Dallas, an important place in history, what happened here 25 years ago," said schoolteacher Jean Hill, who was at the site on Nov. 22, 1963.

Hill brought about 50 students with her Tuesday.

"I want my kids to know it does not take violence to bring about change and that they themselves can be instruments of change and it can be good."

Ernest Saucedo, 20, of Dallas, wasn't born when Kennedy died, but he "just made it my business to come by" the Dealy memorial. "This is history."

The city of Dallas held no official ceremony to mark the anniversary, but 2,500 people gathered where he was shot.

The Kennedy family marked the anniversary with private observances. Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis

attended a private Mass in New York City with her son, John, and daughter, Caroline.

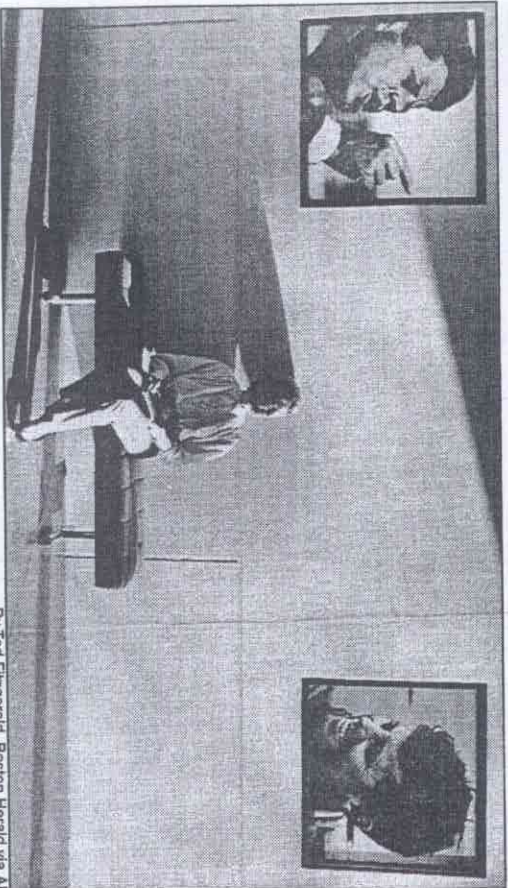
At Virginia's Arlington National Cemetery, several members of the family reflected on Kennedy's legacy.

Eunice Kennedy Shriver, the late president's sister, said she hopes people remember "the high points of his life, the laughter and the visitor."

"I think for the family it's a private moment. It's a wonderful outpouring of love," said Ethel Kennedy, Robert Kennedy's widow.

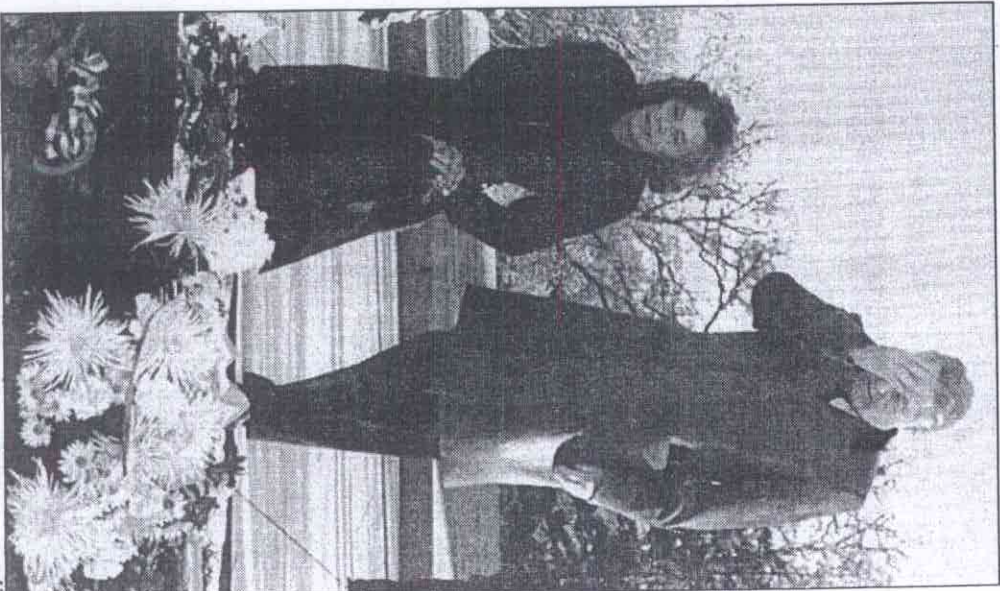

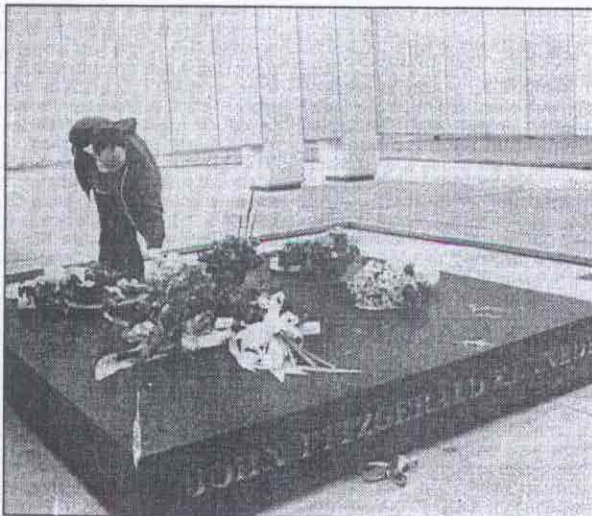
