

WHERE WERE YOU?: Like millions of Americans, Larry King remembers exactly where he was on Nov. 22, 1963, when he learned President Kennedy had been shot: "I was in Miami and I drove right to my radio station (WIOD) and called Grant Stockdale, Kennedy's ambassador to Ireland, to get a comment. He was incomprehensible. He couldn't speak." Five years later, King assembled notables like Richard Nixon and Hubert Humphrey to talk about where they were that day. And in recent years — looking forward to the 30th anniversary — he's been asking guests, after they appear on his CNN talk show, to reminisce about that day. The segments were taped for King's Nov. 21 special on cable's TNT (8 p.m. ET/5 p.m. PT). Panelists including singer Harry Belafonte, CBS' Dan Rather, *The Washington Post's* Ben Bradlee and former ABC correspondent Pierre Salinger, who was Kennedy's press secretary, will talk with King about that day. "It'll be one of the best things I've ever done," King said Tuesday.
