Dallas plaza will be historic landmark

Dealey Plaza in Dallas will be designated a national historic landmark today, the 30th anniversary of President John F. Kennedy's assassination there. Nellie Connally, widow of former Texas governor John Connally, who was seriously wounded in the Nov. 22, 1963, shooting, will take part in the official ceremony. Dallas students will read from Kennedy's writings.

The Kennedy family usually marks the anniversary by placing flowers on the former presi-

dent's grave at Arlington National Cemetery and attending a private Mass in Washington, D.C.

There are no official events in Boston, Kennedy's hometown. "We celebrate Kennedy's birthday, which we think is more appropriate," said Charles Daley, director of the Kennedy presidential library. (Editorial 12A; opinion 13A)
