Where were you when JFK was killed? That's what Larry King asks a slew of celebs in his Nov. 21 TNT special, "November 22, 1963: Where Were You?" King himself was in a car listening to the radio. "I went straight to the radio station where I was working in Miami and telephoned the ambassador to Ireland, Grant

Stockdale, an old friend of Kennedy's whom I knew. He was beyond grief. Several days later, he jumped out his office window." King also recalls his only meeting with Kennedy. "It was '58. I was driving through Palm Beach with three friends, enjoying the sights. I was doing about 5 mph when I ran into a convertible at a red light. It was just a tap, but the guy got out and said, 'How could you hit me? There are only two cars on the road!' I offered to exchange licenses, but he shook his head and said, 'I'm Senator Kennedy and I'm going to run for President in 1960. I want all four of you to vote for me.' We all agreed to do so."


