Kennedy Marathon On Television

TV programs related to next Monday's 30th anniversary of President John F. Kennedy's assassination:

Today

NBC's "Today" show (7 a.m. on Channel 4) begins a week of special features about Kennedy's life and death. On Friday, the program originates from the Kennedy Library in Boston.

"Fatal Deception: Mrs. Lee Harvey Oswald" (9 p.m. on Channel 4) stars Helena Bonham Carter in a TV movie looking at the assassination from Marina Oswald's perspective.

Tomorrow

"Nova" (8 p.m. on Channel 9) repeats a 1988 installment with a scientific examination of the evidence in Kennedy's murder.

"Frontline" (9 p.m. on Channel 9) presents an "investigative biography" of Kennedy's assassin, Lee Harvey Oswald, beginning with his

boyhood.

Wednesday

"Jack" (8 p.m. on Channel 5) is a two-hour CBS entertainment special produced by Emmy- and Oscar-winner Peter Davis, promising an intimate look at Kennedy's family life and public life.

Thursday

"JFK: In His Own Words" (8 p.m. on Channel 9) uses rare film footage and audio tapes of Kennedy's own voice to reveal "the private man behind the public hero."

Friday

"CBS Reports: Who Killed JFK — The Final Chapter" (8 p.m. on Channel 5) uses new technology to sift through the murder evidence. Dan Rather anchors CBS' first investigation of the assassination since ..., last year.

Saturday

"The Kennedys" (8 p.m. on Channel 9) on American Experience is a four-hour repeat of an "American Experience" documentary about the Kennedy family, including the assassinations of John

and Robert F. Kennedy.

Sunday

"November 22, 1963: Where Were You?" (5 p.m. on TNT cable) is a live Larry King special featuring reminiscences of celebrities and journalists.

"JFK: Reckless Youth" (9 p.m. on Channel 7) is a two-part ABC miniseries dramatizing Kennedy's pre-presidential years. Based on Nigel Hamilton's best-seller, it stars Patrick Dempsey ("Mobsters") as Kennedy.

Next Monday

"The Kennedy Years — In Words and Music" (5:15 p.m. on Channel 9) combines photographs of Kennedy by Jacques Lowe with music from the Camelot era.
