Re: Oswald Panel

Date: November 15, 1991, JFK Symposium, Dallas Texas

Jack White is a photographic expert, and states that the backyard photos of Oswald are phony. He stated that the size of the Marxist newspaper is way out of proportion to the rest of the picture. He submits that the body used in the photos could be Roscoe White. He goes on to say that there is a lump on the left wrist, Oswald didn't wear a wrist watch, and when he was exhumed, the skull was in one piece, but the autopsy left it in two. He states that the chins are different as one is too square to be Oswald.

George Evica talked about a second Oswald. He believes that Oswald was a C I A agent, and was impersonated forty times. He states that there is a connection between Hosty, the Dallas Police, and the C I A, and that Oswald's double is James Ellsworth. There is a connection between Lt. Jack Revel and intelligence agencies, and that Revel possessed Oswald intelligence information from the L.E.I.U. James W. Powell assisted police in searching the TSBD. The HSCA learned Revel took care of TSBD employees, and used "Harvey Lee Oswald, 605 Elsbeth."

Mark Lane talked about Priscilla Johnson in Moscow, with Marina when the bus ticket from Mexico City was found in Marina's room. He suggested how Earl Warren was set up with the Mexico City story, complete with the embassy stories. In the end, Warren had to accept the position as chairman of the commission, and stop W W III. Mr. Lane then went on to state that Earl Warren told the commission members to forget their principles and don't put forth the truth on this one.

Gerry Rose talked about the imitation of Lee Oswald. He states that the Nov 8, 1963 Oswald letter to the Soviet embassy is forged, and it was not postmarked until Nov. 12 from Irving.

This panel discussion illustrated the fact that Oswald was not the person in the photo taken by the CIA in Mexico City, and it was not his voice on the tape recording.
