PITTSBURGH, Pa.--(AP)-A forensic pathologist who examined the records and materials of the autonsy berformed on President John F. Kennedy said Saturday that accused assessin Lee Harvey Oswald could not have acted alone.

Dr. Cyril Wecht, Allegheney Country coroner, sold at a new conference a two-day examination of the autospsy materials at the National Archives in Washington, D.C. / convinced bim that it was obvisically impossible? More only one gunman to have stain Kennedy.

FIRST TO EXAMINE Wecht's findings were in direct contradiction hat willy with the Warren keyoft coshiusion that a tingle assassin 'was tesponsible for Kennedy's death, but also with a report by Dr. George K. Lattimer, the tirst private physician to examting the X-rays.

Wecht shid: "The fact is that that hot any one person, could have been a shooter. There had to have been at least two people shooting."

ple shooting Wecht charged that the single assassin findling of the lengthy Waffren Report hinges on the theory that one build lired from a single gun wound ed President Keinedy in the back seat of his limousine, and a ls o wounded and passed brough Texas Gov John Connally, whis Wastriding in the front seat. Wech said Lattimer was chosen as the first private physician to examine the X-rays "because he had made himself into a pro-government -buff on this . . . They sent Lattimer in there because they knew what he would say and what he woould do."

' Liey' Were. Will Water Wecht would say only? "The people who are cager to see to it that nothing is done to reopen this matter." Wecht, a long-time critic of the Warren Report, said he based his findings on an examination last week of X-rays, photographs, tilms, bullets and bullet fragments. Wecht said several "extremely revelant" items-including microscopic slides and Kennedy's brain, which he said was to have been preserved-were not made available to him. DARK OBJECT - "Looking at the X-rays," he said, "I discovered a dark's brownish-black object inside the brain nobody ever mentioned this previously. Nobody ever described it." . He did not say if he thought

the object was a bullet. Wecht said he will submit to Burke Marshall, executor of the Kennedy estate, a proposal for a full review of the autopsy materials by a team of experts.

Wecht, who is also director of the Institute of Forensic Sciences at Duquesne University, was granted permission by Marshall to study the autopsy? maierials.
