

MD Finds JFK Brain Is AWOL

Doctor Cyril Wecht, the coroner of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, says that a two-year effort on his part, to recover key evidence in the assassination of President John Kennedy, has met with failure.

For the past two years, Doctor Wecht has been attempting to track down the whereabouts of Kennedy's brain. This bizarre hunt for the missing J.F.K. brain, was launched by Doctor Wecht in the summer of 1972.

At that time, Doctor Wecht was the first independent medical researcher admitted to the National Archive files, where photographs and tissue samples taken and collected during President Kennedy's autopsy, on the night of November 22, 1963, were stored.

Doctor Wecht discovered that Kennedy's brain -- which, according to officials records, had been preserved in a formalin solution and forwarded to the archives -- was missing. Also missing, he says, were microscope slides of Kennedy's wounds -- slides which would have shown if the bullet wounds were entry or exit wounds.

Doctor Wecht reports that an examination of the brain and would enable him to deter-
