Group Seeks Release Of Files on JFK Slaying

Also Decries AMA Article On Autopsy

Researchers into the assassination of President John F. Kennedy called Friday for the release of all government files on the slaying and challenged presidential candidates to take a stand on the issue.

Speakers for the group, Third Decade, also denounced a recent Journal of the American Medical Association article validating the JFK autopsy, calling it "a fraud."

Dr. Charles Crenshaw, who was in the emergency room at Dallas' Parkland Hospital when the president died, charged that photos, reports and even Kennedy's remains were "doctored" to hide the facts.

Group members spoke to about 100 people at a press conference in the Newberry Library, 80 W. Walton. The event began a three-day symposium on the assassinations of Kennedy, his brother, Robert, and Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Several audience members indicated they had uncovered new information on the killings they would discuss in weekend meetings.

Lectures and discussions, open to the public for a fee, were scheduled for today and Sunday in Thorne Hall on Northwestern University's Chicago campus.

Among Friday's speakers were Crenshaw; Dr. Cyril Wecht, forensic pathologist and autopsy expert; Jim Lessor, president of the Assassination Archives and Research Center in Washington; Robert Groden, an ex-

pert witness at the 1979 hearings of the House Select Committee on Assassinations; John Judge, founder of the Committee for an Open Archive in Washington, and Dr. John Newman, advisor to Oliver Stone on the movie, "JFK."

Many believe there was a conspiracy to murder Kennedy and have written books detailing scientific and political "evidence" of the alleged plot.

In a statement, the group said members were dismayed to learn the former Soviet Union's KGB files on alleged JFK assassin Lee Harvey Os-

wald might be released before equivalent CIA documents.

Judge, who maintained government agencies not only destroyed physical evidence but "planted false evidence," said the sealed documents "owned and paid for by the American people, constitute the history of our country, not a commodity owned by the state."

Current legislation in Congress is far from the full disclosure members would like, but millions of pages of documents exist, and even restricted release will reveal the truth, the group says.

The first annual midwest symposium was a media success. We received approximately 15 media spots in the Chicago area during the week of the conference.
