

This responds to your June 15, 1977 Freedom of Information Act request directed to the United States Secret Service for a copy of a November 28, 1966 letter from Martin Richman, Acting Assistant Attorney General, Office of Legal Counsel, to then Director Rowley of the Secret Service regarding disposition of the windshield of the automobile in which President Kennedy was riding at the time of his assassination (Commission Exhibit No. 350).
