Although in appearance and phrasing this affidavit by Dr. J. Thornton Boswell is made to appear different than that of Fisher, the key words, those for the intended for escape, are identical, "within the realm of medical certainty to the best of my knowledge and belief". As Wecht made clear in his testimony, there are few medical certainties. That "science", particularly as practised by such experts as Fisher, is also much of an art. The date of this affidavit is the day before it was given to Judge Halleck.

Check carefully: absent are similar affidavits by the other five doctors signatory to both reports. Or, compare and analyze them if they exist

and says:

1. On November 22, 1963 I assisted in the performance of an autopsy on the body of the late President, John F. Kennedy. The autopsy reports appearing in the Warren Commission report, pages 538 - 545 are true and correct copies of the original autopsy reports.
2. On January 20, 1967 the autopsy surgeons, including the affiant, examined the autopsy photographs and x-rays, and made a report of their findings, a copy of which is attached hereto.
3. The facts and conclusions contained in the reports mentioned above are true and correct within the realm of medical certainty to the best of my knowledge and belief.
