Photo and X-rays of the fact that the pictures autopsy on the body of President John F. Kennedy never seen by the Warren Commission - have been turned over to the National Archives by his family.

The family's action taken at the request of the Justice Department, was disclosed yesterday by a Department spokesman in answer questions as to the whereabouts of the pictures - 14 X-rays, 25 black and white negatives, and 26 color transparencies.

The pictures were taken during the autopsy performed on the slain President at Bethesda Naval Medical Center on the night of Nov. 22-23, 1963. Two of the three pathologists who performed the post-mortem examination verified the pictures, officials said."

## CRITICISM

The spokesman said recent criticism of the Warren Commission's investigation of the assassination was indirectly responsible for the Department's request that the family turn the pictures over to the National Archives.
