T. W. RICHARDSON was interviewed at the Riverside Hotel, which he said is his residence and where he said he can be located at any time.

He was informed that he did not have to make a statement, that he had a right to an attorney, and that hay statement he did nmake could be used against him in court.

He denied knowing ARTHUR JAMES BALLETTI. He said he recalls from newspaper publicity at the time of the incident, the allegations that the telephone of DAN BOVAN was subject to surveillance. He denied having had any connection with the incident, and denied having paid any money to anyone in connection with the incident.

He was informed that the United States Attorney's Office might at a later date bring this matter before a Federal Grand Jury, and that if so he would be subject to subpeena. He said he had no objections to so appearing as he had nothing to hide.

He mise advised that if he were placed in a group of men that he doubts that BALLETTI would be able to identify him unless he may have seen him in Las Vegas and know who RICHARDSON is just from common knowledge. He reiterated that he does not know BALLETTI or who BALLETTI is.

County Sheriff's Office, advised on May 15, 1961, records of that office reflect that the charges of ARTHUR JAMES BALLETTI unauthorized intervention of privacy and operating as a private detective without a license, were dismissed on April 24, 1961, inasmuch as the complaining witness did not desire to prosecute.
