La. Slaying Theory Discusses

NEW ORLEANS, La., Dec. 11-Louisiana Attorney General William Guste acknowledged today that some members of the biracial commission investigating the deaths of two Southern University students have concluded both were killed by a single shotgun blast, but he denied reports they were near identifying the person who fired the fatal shot.

Guste, questioned about a report in the New York Times. said the 12-member commission had reached no consensus on the issue of who fired the fatal shots.

The Times, quoting sources close to the investigation, said today that authorities "have just about pinpointed the spot" from which the shots were fired and members believe it is now possible to identify who fired the shot.

The newspaper also repeated reports from last week that the commission was expected to conclude that the same shotgun blast killed Leonard Douglas Brown and Denver A. Smith.

The two died in a confrontation with police in front of the school administration building Nov. 16.

Gov. Edwin W. Edwards, meanhile; said former New York Times editor Turner Catledge may have leaked the story.

Catledge is a member of the 12-member biracial commission empaneled for the probe.
