As my files get more and more jammed, I seek ways of getting space. One thing I know I have no need for is the clipping I did on the Kopeckne case. Would you like these clippings? They include all the Washington Post coverage, until I stopped clipping.

Howard will be keeping the index up to date as I send him copies of my correspondence. He has completed it to this date. I think it would be a valuable thing to be able to include everyone's correspondence, and he agrees. He'll make cards of those letters I can get for him and I'll be keeping them in a separate file, for court use, if necessary. I think these could be quite helpful there.

I enjoyed having him here and am happy that our interests coincided. I think his knowledge and understand are now greater.

One thing alone disturbs me. I think he is too interested in this alone. He showed no signs of interest in anything else, nor in conversation about anything else. Let us please this, for he should not eliminate too much so wonderful from his life and so early. I think we can do it without embarrassing him, if we are careful. And neither pushy nor intrusive.

He's welcome whenever he wants to return, as he knows. I'll be surprised if he isn't here again before school starts.

It appears the Times carried nothing on the release of the Ray stuff. The Post's story is enclosed. There was one in the NY Daily News that didn't mention my name, Jerry P. tells me. No time to have heard from elsewhere, and I've no interest in publicity, for me or for the material.
